## Postal charges are up

Without a big fanfare *la poste* increased the cost of posting mail in France and overseas from 1 July.



First class has gone up to 0.60€ for an envelope weighing up to 20g; and one weighing up to 50g will now cost 1.00€.



Sending letters back to loved ones in the UK will now cost 0.77€ for an envelope weighing under 20g. No increase for those weighing up to 50g which is still 1.35€.



Using 2<sup>nd</sup> class post will also cost more. An envelope weighing up to 20g is 0.55€ and one weighing up to 50g is 0.78€.

## INTERNAL RULES & REGULATIONS

Following on from my May Newsletter report on the AGM, I have been in discussions, via e-mail, with the two Members who wanted it made clear, through an amendment to the Internal Rules & Regulations, that Members had the right to put forward proposals at the AGM.

I drafted a change to Rule 6 which made it clear that Members had this right and passed the draft to the two Members in question. My draft included a provision which clearly gave the Committee the right to veto any such proposal following discussion at a subsequent Committee meeting. This right of veto was incorporated because BAV, as a 1901 Association, is not recognised as a legal persona separate from its members. All legal responsibility rests with the Chairman and, in some cases, other Committee Members who have been formally given specific powers on behalf of the Association. So, clearly, without a right of veto the Committee could not prevent proposals being adopted which might break the law. Similarly, it could not veto proposals which clearly were frivolous or impossible to implement or those that would increase the burden of work for the Committee (unless, of course the proposer was prepared to shoulder the burden him/herself).

The two Members who had raised this at the AGM were not happy with the right of veto because they felt that this flew in the face of democracy and they wished to see BAV run as a totally democratic organisation. Unfortunately, the way that French law operates in respect of 1901 associations prevents them from ever being truly democratic in the real sense of the word.

The amendment has been discussed again by the Committee and it has been agreed that the new Rule 6 should be extended to include a provision that all proposals which have been vetoed by the Committee will be reported in the Newsletter, together with the reasons for the veto. At the end of the operational year, all vetoed proposals, and the reasons for the veto, will be included in the AGM papers so that members have the opportunity to express their views or suggest modifications which might make them acceptable for further consideration.

I, personally, saw no need to commit this rule to paper because, in reality, the right to put forward proposals, and the right of veto, exist without it.

There is always a danger, when trying to set out such rights, that the written rule actually applies a restriction to the common law right. I hope that my deliberately general wording, which you will be asked to adopt at the AGM next year, avoids this.

# Half Year Financial Report 30 June 2011

This is the first half-year Financial Report of the British Association of the Var and we are still in a good position with regard to our reserves. Please remember that less than 2 years ago we had spent on welfare in 6 months over 25% of our reserves and if that level of assistance had continued, we would now have no reserves. The comment I heard "what difference does my small donation make when BAV has thousands", well the reserves have been accumulated by donations and fund raising. From small acorns... (or in the Var's case from one drop of rain).

## Funds

The general cash reserves of the Association are held in four parts.

1. Current account at Credit Agricole.
2. A call deposit account with Credit Agricole which earns a low level of interest, but at least it earns something.
3. A fixed term deposit account with the bank, which this year gave us a 4% return.
4. Loans due to be repaid.

These reserves have been built up over many years and we should attempt to have more income than costs each year to increase the reserves.

## Income

This year we have had a major problem with our fund raising. As you know the Aups picnic had to be cancelled due to the weather and the BAT's shows will not happen this year, these events raise over 3,500€ a year (our thanks go to the Members who told us to bank their cheques for the Aups picnic as donations).

The main income for this year comes from:

- Subscriptions and Donations
- Interest
- Sponsorship
- Functions

We have also received income from the sale of cards etc.

The subscriptions received this year will not be enough to cover the administration costs of the Association, the shortfall for the half year is over 2,400€.

## Expenditure

The costs of running the Association can only be maintained at such a low level thanks to all the helpers and volunteers, many of whom do so at no cost. The Committee receives no expenses for attending meetings or attending functions, in fact they have to pay the same as everyone else to attend.

The main costs are for welfare, the AGM printing and postage, the Newsletter and the Address Book, and in order to give Members an idea of where we are, I have used the first 6 months of 2010 from the Var Branch as a comparative.

## What is the Welfare Team able to do to help you?

Over the last 10 months the Welfare Team has been busy with a number of different situations, many of them current before 'Independence Day' on 1 November 2010.

A lot of work went into rewriting BAV's governing rules in the form of Statutes in accordance with the 1901 French law governing associations, for which we are very grateful to Clare Brown our Secretary, her French professor Dominique, the team at Actes6 and of course the BAV Committee for all their input.

One of the things highlighted was that the level of support we, the team, were giving to some of our clients was bordering on being illegal under French business and employment law. As a result of this the Committee has put together some guidelines as to what we, the Welfare Team and its supporting volunteers, are able to do to assist clients.

REMEMBER this is not set in stone but to be used as guidelines.

The funds for welfare are raised by the Members and therefore, when asking for assistance, clients will be asked to join BAV if they are not already members - their financial situation will determine whether they will be expected to pay the subscription and become full members or welfare members. They will be offered Welfare membership for 1 year and then we hope that they will become full members. BAV's Statutes make it clear that it is a charity set up to assist anyone in the department of the Var who holds a British Passport or who is entitled to hold a British Passport. This includes residents of and visitors to the Var.

**1.** The BAV Welfare Team can make, or organise, unlimited visits to individuals in their home or in hospital, when it is purely on a 'visiting' basis - ie - no work is involved. General welfare helpers will be asked to assist with these requests.

**2.** If any work is required eg laundry, food preparation, cleaning or assistance with administration - it will only be done until such time as alternative arrangements have been made for it to be undertaken by either family or a properly registered and authorised commercial agency. The agencies treat each job separately and charge accordingly and will require payment

for travel to outlying rural areas on top of payments for the services provided. In some cases *mutuelle* top up insurance covers some of this - check your policy.

For those people holding a *Carte Vitale* there are agencies, recognised by Social Services, who provide the support that the Welfare Team and volunteers have been asked to do in the past.

**PLEASE NOTE** - Often, the provision of this support is illegal as it is taking work away from authorised French agencies - an offence for which we could be prosecuted and carries a fine. For those on low income they will be assessed and maybe required to pay a minimal amount. For those that do not qualify, provided they are classed as fiscally resident in France, they can receive a tax rebate to cover everything from home care to a gardener - provided the services are properly registered. The best way to find out which businesses are properly registered to do this kind of work is from your *Mairie* or through one of the agencies that exist in almost every village. The Welfare Team can assist in making contact with these agencies. If you pay your taxes anywhere other than France you can use this service but you will not receive any tax relief.

**3.** The Welfare Team can provide a service to clients who require a 'sitter' for their partner with no limit on the number of occasions, provided there is a volunteer available. Note - overnight 'sitting' is not possible. If required you should contact the appropriate agency - The Welfare Team can help you make contact with them. See Note 2.

**4.** If a client is hospitalised and has pets they should check their *mutuelle* - it might include limited cover for pet care. A temporary arrangement will be sought among Members but if this is not possible there are a number of *animaux* pensions available in the Var which would require payment from the client.

**5.** The BAV Welfare team can take clients to doctor/dentist or to hospital appointments, or can make arrangements for another volunteer to do so but only when no official transport is available. As a rule, official transport is not made available to patients who are able to walk but it can vary from doctor to doctor so you should always ask the doctor if transport is possible - for 2 primary reasons:

**a.** If you are using a BAV volunteer or friend to transport you and the weather is bad the

volunteer/ friend may prefer not to make the journey, especially long distances.

**b.** A BAV volunteer technically is not insured to make the trip unless she/he is a family member or friend. BAV itself does not carry insurance cover for these trips. If you use official hospital transport it will come to collect you and return you home regardless of the weather. You are also fully insured whilst in their care. If you become ill you have medical help on hand. If the need is regular, and your driver is unable to come, they will automatically find a replacement - you need do nothing.

**6.** Where any type of counselling or medical consultation is required they must be obtained through the French medical system. Although we have Members who have various UK qualifications in these areas BAV will not attempt to use them. If Bereavement Counselling is required we will direct you to the Bereavement Support Network which also covers counselling through life threatening illnesses. This is a French Registered organisation run by British counsellors.

The Welfare Coordinator is in the process of compiling a list of English speaking medical professionals in the Var. This will only be as good as the Members' input. Please call the Welfare mobile 06 43 86 49 01 or send an email to [welfare@bavofthevar.com](mailto:welfare@bavofthevar.com) to give details of English speaking medical professionals you have used or for details of someone on the list if you need the service. In providing these names BAV does not accept responsibility for the quality of their service even though the details have been provided by Members of BAV.

**7.** In the case of becoming homeless BAV will assist you to contact the relevant departments within the French system and the various associations who are able to deal with this type of problem. In most cases there will be no help unless you are part of the French social security system. BAV may be able to assist with any necessary deposit by way of an advance in respect of individuals with inadequate funds available.

**8.** The Welfare Team will assist in contacting the various departments within the UK Social Services regarding state pensions etc. As always, any information will be treated with the utmost confidentiality.

**9.** Unfortunately there continues to be a large number of persons not REGISTERED in the

French tax system despite living in France for more than 6 months of the year. With technology being so sophisticated the various tax departments are now in communication with each other and they are looking for these people. If you are caught BAV will not provide financial assistance to you. We will however provide you with the list of English speaking *notaires* and *avocates* provided by the British Consulate in Marseille.

**Members of the Committee and Welfare Team are all volunteers and will respond to your enquiry as soon as they possibly can. So please remember not to leave things until they reach crisis point – it is more difficult to find a solution in the short term.**
